

Gray's Creek Conservation Area & Marina opened in April 1979, making this the Marina's 43rd boating season.

The Marina provides boaters and anglers with immediate access to the St.
Lawrence River, surrounded by nature's beauty throughout the Conservation Area. The surrounding waters of the St.
Lawrence River offer recreation and relaxation for boaters and anglers alike.

Amenities of the marina include a large parking area, launching ramp, and service building offering gas, oil and other sundry sales. Day and seasonal boaters are welcome. Located east of Cornwall, Gray's Creek Conservation Area & Marina offers 43 hectares of natural landscape, including meandering trails that are open year round. Gray's Creek features a picturesque family park with picnic area, shelter, playground and charcoal BBQ for your convenience. Public washrooms are available.

Located strategically at the mouth of Gray's Creek, the Marina comfortably provides 128 open slips, which can be rented during the boating season. The marina is currently operating at full capacity, with all seasonal slips rented. However, there are some slips available for transient use. Boat launch services are available for the general public by paying a daily launch fee or purchasing a seasonal launch pass.

Visitors to the Marina can enjoy 6.4 kilometers of meandering trails to enjoy nature in all its beauty. Explore the trails and keep an eye out for the wide variety of animals, songbirds, amphibians and waterfowl that inhabit this significant Conservation Area. Geocaches are also hidden with the trail system.

Visitors can also enjoy cycling, hiking and walking their pets both on the nature trails and the paved bike path.
