Adoption of Asset Management Plan

Previously, Marco Vincelli of EVB Engineering presented Council with an Asset Management Plan for Municipal Infrastructure. This proposed Asset Management Plan has been approved by Council and thus, has been adopted by the Township of South Glengarry, in accordance with Ontario Regulation 588/17. Following the adoption of the Asset Management Plan, Administration will post the approved document to the Township website. Recognizing the importance of relevant and accurate asset management data, Administration will continue to collect information to adapt an update the Asset Management Plan as time progresses.

Donation Request – St. Lawrence Valley Agricultural Society

The St. Lawrence Valley Agricultural Society has requested a \$17,500 donation from Council to assist with the operation of the 211th Annual Williamstown Fair. \$10,000 to be put towards the costs of the Fair, for advertising, building and property upgrades and other must have expenses. \$5,000 to go towards the cost of installing Wi-Fi connectivity throughout the Fairgrounds, it has been an ongoing project and the project has been contracted out – the money will pay the remaining balance for the project. \$2,500 will be used to sponsor their Movie Night in July, which will be a free event for the people of South Glengarry to attend. Taking into consideration the 2022 budgeted amount for Grants and Donations, Council ultimately decided to donate \$11,000.00 which in turn depletes the Townships budget for Grants and Donations in 2022.



Char-Lan Recreation Centre – Advertisement Agreement

Previously, Council directed Administration to prepare advertisement agreements with the Junior B Rebels, Char-Lan Minor Hockey Association (CLMHA) and the Char-Lan Skating Club (CLSC). The proposed agreements outline the amount and location of the advertisements, as well as the materials, measurements, and layout details for the advertisements. The Junior B Rebels will obtain 100% of the current board advertisements. The CLMHA and CLSC will each obtain two in-ice logos and one ice resurfer advertisement. Council has approved these proposed agreements for the 2022-2023 season.
