SDG Historical Plaque Project

The plaque project will see the creation of three (3) plagues in each lower tier municipality of SDG. The plaques will include reproductions of historic photos and content and preferably will be located on townshipowned property or public lands that are easily accessible by the public. Council approved the location for the SG plagues in Green valley, Glen Walter and The Peanut Line.

Municipal Modernization

The Township has been approved for funding up to \$152,640.00 through the MMP Intake 3. Funds received will help the Township analyze options for digitization of both accounts receivable and accounts payable, human resources processes and overall operations as a means to adapting to remote work and reducing overall costs.

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
